City of Fertile Council Meeting Minutes  
June 21, 2011 - 7:00 PM at City Hall

**Call to Order & Roll Call:**

Present were: Mayor Joyce Russell. Council Members: Jeff Berg, Penny Miller, Tad Miller, Cindy Peters and Pat Renchn and Maintenance Manager Buck Russell. City Clerk Eddie May was absent and Penny Miller took the minutes of the meeting.

Cindy montioned and Tad seconded to approve the minutes. Carried.

The public meeting closed at 7:05 p.m. and re-opened at 8:15 p.m.

**Mayor's Report:**

The Worth County Sheriff's department will be using city buildings for canine training.

WCDA Scholarship Awards were given to 12 seniors from Forest City in the amount of \$5,536.81 each on May 19 by Mayor Russell. Most of the High School Seniors were from Fertile.

Thank you to Keith Breka for spraying all the weeds at the new city hall and ball diamont. Buck and Joyce sprayed the rest of the city.

Buck purchased cold patch from Menards. Buck and Warren tried to patch some of the potholes in town, but it has been either too cold or too rainy. Some of the holes were filled on the West side of town.

City Wide Clean-up on May 28th went well. Pat, Eddie, Buck and the mayor all worked. Jeff Berg ran the skid loader. A total of 31 tickets were turned in. Three people had to be turned away because the dumpsters were too full. Thank you to Ray Sandifer for taking all of the metal.

Brian Nettleton charged \$750 to bury the pile of burned debris at the West corner of the the city hall. The sand pile was left for possible use for the driveway.

A phone vote for approval of excavation and material for the parking lot at the new city hall, in the amount of \$9,500 was requested by the Mayor. It passed. The work will be done for a new parking lot on the South and to re-do the East side of the building.

Cindy Peters attended the FEMA meeting held in Hanlontown regarding the new flood plain maps. The mayor could not attend. The new map is displayed at city hall.

Received a letter from the Post Office: Kevin Richardson contacted the owners of the post office to sign and renew the lease. It has been signed and renewed.

Parking Ordinance: The mayor will be mailing out a letter to all of the citizens of Fertile reminding everyone about the parking laws for both winter and summer.

New dug-outs for the ball diamonds have been installed for ther West field. Buck put new flex tubing on to fulfill city insurance requirements.

Clapper Tree service removed the two evergreen trees in front of the city hall building. This was requested to be done by Alliant Energy as they were obstructing the main electrical service into the city. Thank you to Kenny, Buck and Joyce for cleaning up the trees and debris.

A complaint from the East side of town regarding gravel trucks using our newly paved blacktop street, instead of the regular route, was called in to the Mayor. BMC was notified and the truck is no longer using 2nd street as part of his route.

An EMS meeting was attended by the Mayor. The class gave information regarding procedures for dealing with the press during an emergency.

Complaints regarding untended yards of vacant houses for sale in town were received by the Mayor. Realtors have been called and asked to mow and maintain the yards on a regular basis for houses at 207 East Main Street, 210 West Main Street and 501 West Washington.

The WCDA grant application has changed. The new regulations will focus on larger projects and less on minor improvements or requests.

Another application for the city maintenance position was received but did not meet all of the requirements. We are still taking applications.

The mayor attended a Worth County Supervisor and Trustee meeting regarding expansion of the Diamond Jo Welcome Center at I-35 exchange.

Pat Renchin motioned and Cindy seconded to approve and pay the bills for May.

**MAINTENANCE REPORT:**

The lagoons have been drained down. An estimate for a new weed-eater for \$341.58 was presented and approved. Problems with the generator in the water lagoon have developed. Buck will talk to Fred Hare to discuss repair for that generator as well as our new generator. Spraying the lagoon for thistles will also be looked into. There is a tree beside the dam that needs to be removed.

**OTIER BUSINESS:**

Fertile Days preparations are going well.

New doors have been installed for the community center and remodeling is on schedule.

Complaints have been received about dogs running loose in town. Complaints regarding nuisance dogs have also been received. The owners have been warned.

Pat Renchin motioned and Tad Miller seconded to adjourn the meeting.
