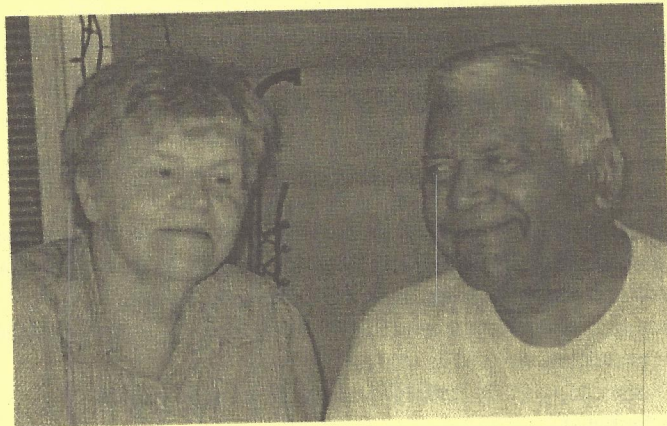

We are honored to have **Al and Jane Ramon** as our **Grand Marshall's** for the parade this year. Al and Jane moved to the area in 1978 and left the area in 1988. City Council Meeting Minutes

May 19, 2012 - 7:00 PM, City Hall

Call to Order & Roll Call

- Present were: Mayor Joyce Russell; Council Members: Jeff Berg, Julie Jessen, Penny Miller, Tad Miller, & Pat Renchin; Maintenance Manager Steve Roberts & City Clerk Eddie May.
- *Jeff motioned, Pat 2nd to approve the May Minutes.* Motion Carried.

Fertile Days Committee

- Rick Anderson, and the committee requested permission and financing to host a fireworks presentation during Fertile Days. The display would last 10-15 minutes and would cost \$1,600. The committee would do fundraising to help cover the costs.
- The Council was concerned that the presenter does not cover insurance for the event. The Council also considered that the City is facing a substantial financial deficit this year.
- The Council and the committee agreed to hold off with the fireworks until next year. We will research possible insurance waivers now and will start fundraising right away. (The fireworks for the sesquicentennial cost around \$5,000-6,000 for a longer show and the presenter was covered by insurance.)

Public Hearing for Flood Plain Update

- At 7:40 Mayor Russell opened the public hearing to adopt an amendment to the Flood Plain Ordinance
- FEMA has presented new flood maps and GPS procedures
- Nobody from the public were present to make any comments
- *Tad motioned, Julie 2nd to waive the 2nd & 3rd Hearings. Roll Call Vote was unanimous.* Motioned Carried
- *Tad motioned, Julie 2nd to approve the amendment. Roll Call Vote was unanimous.* Motioned Carried

City Maintenance Report

- Last month-90% of time was spent on community center open house
- Rest of time mowing, weeding, and landscaping, especially at the lagoon & park.
- Draw-down at lagoon is done-all valves worked
- Still having problems with generator, solenoid not working
- The sewer pumps had to be pulled to clear out clothing & towels that had wrapped around the pumps. It costs residents \$800 each time the pumps need to be unclogged. It appears that someone is pulling up the manholes to drop clothing into the system. Please help us keep from raising the sewer bills by helping us catch the person(s) responsible.
- Since it has been so dry, the sheep were taken out of the lagoon property to keep them from eating too much of the grass
- Steve will create a system of hose reels for Garden Club at City Hall
- Steve will be doing some more landscaping around town
- Eddie reported that the City is still pumping twice as much water as it is billing. Three water leaks were fixed last month, but the City is continuing to investigate how the water loss may be happening.

Mayor's Report

- In May, the WCDA awarded college scholarships in the amount of \$6,676.63 to each of this year's 11 Forest City graduates from Fertile
- Attended Sheriff/911 meeting on May 19 & completed GPS updates
- Installed flags on Main St. for Memorial Day. The Garden Club hung banners after Memorial Day and will put the flags back in for the 4th.

- On May 26th lightning hit water tower and damaged the 911 repeater. Fire Department paging system, a street light, Little League scoreboard, Lutheran Church transformers, concession stand, and light on top of water tower. This was all turned into insurance.
- May 1st - June 7th got ready for the community center open house. Thanks to everyone who gave food for the Worth County Food Bank at the open house. A big thanks to the Downtown Café for catering the meal. Everything went great!
- Reservations are being taken for renting the Community Center and City Hall. Information is posted on our website (fertileiowa.us)
- June 5th Primary Election took place at the City Hall
- June 9th Alumni Banquet took place in the Community Center. During the event, Mayor Russell received an Honorary Fertile Alumni Certificate of Achievement.
- June 9th City wide clean up went very smoothly. A big thanks to everyone who helped load the dumpsters, and a big thanks to CAD for doing a really good job removing our old appliances!
- June 10th 11:00-11:30 PM Sheriff was called to the Park for noise complaints. Please remember that the park closes at 10PM
- There have been reports of vandalism and theft around town.
- Please help enforce the 10pm curfew and 11pm noise ordinances.

- Eddie presented the May Financials (92% through the year)

Deficit in General/Housing is caused by the creation of the Business Incubator, overages on the Community Center project, and the City's portion of the Housing Project. The surplus in the Roads/WCDA fund is caused by savings for lighting projects and zeros out the WCDA fund from a net loss last year. Eddie believes we will end the year with a deficit.

- *Pat motioned, Penny 2nd to approve May Bills.* Motion Carried.

Committee Reports

- **Library Project:** Eddie suggested that we publish a public notice soliciting bids for complete architectural renderings, blueprints and materials lists. Eddie proposed the following timeline: architectural plans approved in August, Construction bids received in September, bids approved in November, Grant written/submitted in January.
Penny motioned, Pat 2nd to approve publication of the public notice soliciting architectural services. Motion Passed
- The weeds & garbage committee wants to remind residents to keep grass and weeds below the 12" height limit stated in the ordinances. Also, noxious weeds of any height must be removed. Please help us keep Fertile beautiful!

Other Business

- The Council verified that the City has a current Vulnerability Assessment and Emergency Response Plan for the Water/Sewer systems as required by the USDA.
- The Council agreed that the Little League can use the ball diamond lights 2 nights per week for practice, as long as the lights are turned off by 9:30pm. Lights can be used for games as needed.

- The Fertile City Council will meet in regular session at 7:00PM, Tuesday, July 17th, 2012, at Fertile City Hall.

MONEY SAVING IDEA

Make your own baby wipes

A round plastic container with a tight-fitting lid
Thick, strong roll of white paper towels (Viva or Bounty brand works best, as they are very thick and strong but also soft and cloth-like)
Sharp, serrated knife to cut paper towel roll in half.

2 cups water that has been boiled and cooled to room temperature

2 Tbsp. baby shampoo or baby wash

1 Tbsp. baby oil

First, cut your paper towel roll in half and remove the inner cardboard tube.

Then mix your liquid ingredients in container and place one of the paper towel halves inside, cut side down (save the other half for the next time you need to make wipes). Put the lid of the container on tightly and let it sit until all the liquid is absorbed. Next, turn the container upside down and let it sit for about 10 minutes. Then turn it right side up, open your container, and "start" your roll by pulling a towel from the center of the roll.

You can also use a baby wipes empty container, separate your towel and pour the solution in it. **I have used these and they are as good or better than what you buy and at a great savings. Give them for gifts!!**



Goodbye Fruit Flies: To get rid of pesky fruit flies, take a small glass, fill it 1/2" with Apple Cider Vinegar and 2 drops of dish washing liquid; mix well. You will find those flies drawn to the cup and gone forever! **THIS WORKS!!**

W COOKER SPANISH HAMBURGER

- 1 pound hamburger cooked and drained.
 - 2 - 14 1/2 cans diced tomatoes (undrained)
 - 2 cups water
 - 1 1/2 cups long grain rice (can be brown rice)
 - 1 cup Salsa
 - 1 medium onion - chopped
 - 1 4 oz. Can green chilies (optional)
 - 2 envelope Taco Seasoning
- Mix in slow cooker and cook on low for 4 to 6 hours (until rice is tender).

WORLD'S EASIEST FUDGE

- 3 cups chocolate chips (I use 1 cup mint chips)
 - 1 14 oz can Sweetened Condensed Milk
 - 2 tsp. Vanilla
 - 1/3 cup powdered sugar.
- In a microwavable bowl mix chocolate chips and milk. Microwave on high for 2 minutes. Stir until melted and shiny. Add vanilla and powdered sugar. Stir until smooth. Pour into a greased 8x8 pan. Chill

HOUSEHOLD HINTS

- >Wooden spoons are desirable for candy making because they not get to hot to handle.
- >Make homemade candies from one to two weeks ahead. Store in tins lined with wax paper. Fudge, caramels and fondants improve when stored in this manner.
- >To ship homemade fudge successfully for some distance, pour it while warm into a tin pan which has been lined with several thicknesses of waxed paaper. Leave sufficient paper to cover thetop adequately and the fundge can be lifed out by means of it. The recipient who cuts the candy finds it as fresh as when it was packed.
- >Bottles and daubers from liquid shoe polish (if you still shine your own shoes) makes good paint sets for tiny tots. Wash bottles and daubers, fill bottles with water colors. The dauber is easier to use than a slender brush - less messy than finger painting.
