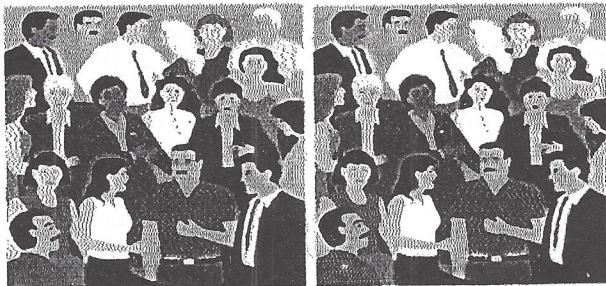

City Council Meeting Minutes

May 15, 2012 - 7:00 PM, City Hall

Call to Order & Roll Call

- Present were: Mayor Joyce Russell; Council Members: Jeff Berg, Julie Jessen, Penny Miller, & Pat Renchin; Maintenance Manager Steve Roberts & City Clerk Eddie May. Absent was Council Member Tad Miller
- Pat motioned, Julie 2nd to approve the April Minutes. Motion Carried.

City Maintenance Report

- Mowing & weed control every day that it hasn't been raining
- Sewer generator hasn't been kicking in, Hare Electric has temporarily fixed it, but the system still needs deeper diagnostics
- Cut-up and started to burn fallen tree at the ball fields
- Installed a park bench at City Hall, donated by Jan Hare & Sisters in memory of their Father: Stan Zirbel.
- Honorariums and memorials at the Community Center/City Hall are welcomed. Please contact City Hall before making arrangements.
- Fixed the issue of flags blowing off light poles on Main.
- Replaced furnace filters in the Library.
- Found 3 water leaks throughout town, in process of having them fixed
- Recent rain has caused sewer lagoons to exceed containment levels. DNR will place fines on the City if this continues. Residents are asked to check their sump pump hoses to be certain they do not flow into the City sewer system.

Community Center / Business Incubator

- Continuing to complete the incubator leasable space -- hand railings have been installed in the stair well, half-wall is being sheet rocked.
- Occupant has hired their 1st new employee since moving in.
- Community Center: countertops, plumbing, and electrical will all be done this week. A few more touch-ups will be completed next week. Floors will be waxed on Friday. Deep clean will be done on June 4th.
- Rental rates have been set through December 2012. Rates, per day, for residents will be \$175 plus a \$100 returnable deposit. Rates for non-residents will be \$225 plus a \$100 returnable deposit. There is an additional \$25 charge to set-up the night before or to clean-up the day after an event if available. **Jeff moved, Pat 2nd to approve full day rentals only.** Penny voted against, Motion Carried. Rates will be re-evaluated in November based on actual cost of maintaining the Center and may be adjusted for 2013. Please contact City Hall for more information. **Julie moved, Pat 2nd to approve temporary rates as stated above, to be re-evaluated in November.** Motion Carried.
- There will be an Open House for the Community Center on Thursday June 7th from 6:00 pm to 7:30 pm. Hors d'oeuvres will be served. The public is invited to attend. Invitations will be sent to all Fertile residents. Price of attendance is one non-perishable food item to be donated to the Worth County Food Bank.

Mayor's Report

- City Clean-up is on Saturday, June 9th from 8 am to noon (or until dumpsters are filled). Dumpsters will be located on Main Street (no early dumping). Appliances can be picked up at your curbside -- some for a fee, others for free. Details will be mailed on a postcard to all residents. A stub from that postcard is needed to participate.
- On April 7th, met at Courthouse to update the GIS maps for 911.
- Will present WCDA scholarships to Worth County students in Forest City tomorrow night.

- Eddie presented the April Financials (83% through the year)

Deficit is caused primarily by Housing Grant and Community Center Grant money that has been spent, but has not been reimbursed by the CDBG or the WCDA yet. Eddie anticipates a net income by year end

- Pat motioned, Penny 2nd to remove the following lien: 104 Mill Street for \$270. Motion Carried. Lien was paid to the City, rather than the County, so it needed to be cleared from the County's system.

- The Fertile City Council will meet in regular session at 7:00PM, Tuesday, June 19th, 2012, at Fertile City Hall. There will be a Public Hearing to amend the Flood Plain Ordinance at this meeting.
- Julie moved and Jeff 2nd to adjourn the meeting. Motion Carried.

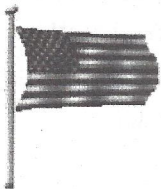

JUNE 14 FLAG DAY

On June 14, Americans celebrate the adoption of the first national flag. The first American flag was approved by the Continental Congress on June 14, 1777. In 1818, after 5 more states joined the Union, Congress passed legislation fixing the number of stripes at 13 and requiring that the number of stars equal the number of states.

In 1916, President Woodrow Wilson issued a proclamation that officially established June 14 as Flag Day; in August 1949, National Flag Day was established by an Act of Congress.

The United States Flag Code stipulates that as the symbol of a living country, the flag is considered in itself a living thing and should be properly displayed and cared for. The code outlines the proper ways to display the American flag.

- Raise the flag briskly. Lower it ceremoniously.
- Never allow the flag to touch the ground or floor.
- Do not fly the flag in bad weather, unless it is an all-weather flag.
- The flag can only be flown at night if properly illuminated. Otherwise, it should only be flown from sunrise to sunset.
- The flag should always be allowed to fall free.
- The flag should never be used to carry, store, or deliver anything.
- Never fly the flag upside down except to signal an emergency.

Be sure to check out the flags on main street. They are changed several times a year by the Garden Club. And while you are observing the flags, take notice of the flower pots!!

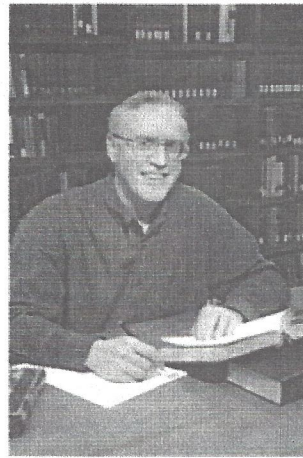

I buy all these at the Dollar Store or Dollar General and use the store brand or the cheapest you can find.

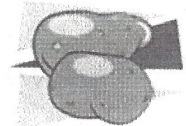
I use a hand mixer starting with the Vaseline to get it softened, add the rest of the ingredients. You may have to cut the baby lotion bottle open to empty it all.

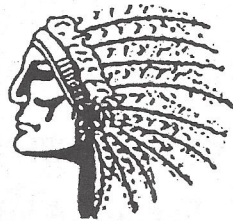
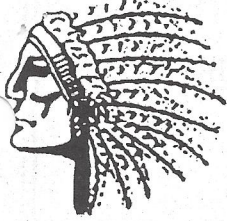

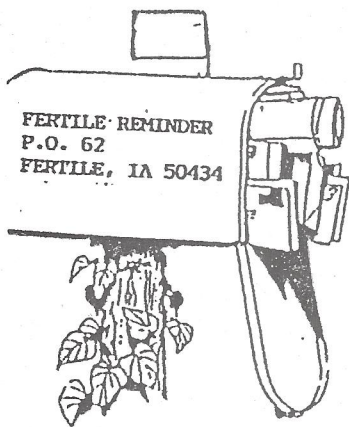
