City of Fertile

City Council Meeting Minutes February 21, 2011 - 7:00 PM, City Hall

Call to Order & Roll Call

- Present were: Mayor Joyce Russell; Council Members: Jeff Berg, Julie Jessen, Penny Miller, & Tad Miller; Maintenance Manager Steve Roberts & City Clerk Eddie May. Absent was: Council Member Pat Renchin.
- Last month's minutes omitted the following motion: *Jeff* motioned, Pat 2nd to enforce the ordinance regarding the removal of all road side obstacles which may hamper snow removal or traffic flow. Carried
- Tad motioned, Julie 2nd to approve the Jan. Minutes with correction stated above. Carried.

Public Hearing: Fertile Housing Rehabilitation Program

- Mayor Russell announced that this was the time and place for a Public Hearing on the status of funded activities for the City of Fertile CDBG Housing Rehabilitation Program, which was financed by a Housing Fund grant awarded in 2009.
- The hearing was opened by Mayor Russell at 7:05 p.m.
- Steve Wendt of the North Iowa Area Council of Governments, which is providing general administrative assistance for the program, gave several comments on the program including:
 - A general description of the accomplishments to date.
 - A summary of grant and local match expenditures to date: \$191,196 of the \$222,540 in available grant funds has been drawn down to date, and the City has expended \$10,900 of its \$12,000 total local match obligation.
- A general description of the work completed work remaining (6 projects have been completed & 1 is in progress)
- Performance target increase from 6 to 7 homes rehabilitated
- Activity schedules
- And changes to the original project budget, as shown by a breakdown of the final costs expended on each of the 6 projects completed to date, and the funds obligated to date on the one final project in progress.
- Wendt then answered questions from the City Council.
 - The Council intends on applying for the Housing Rehabilitation Funding again in the fall of 2013. If awarded, additional projects could begin again in 2014.
 - The Council wants to give NIACOG and CDBG a big thank you for their hard work in making this program a success!
- Having no further discussion or comments, Mayor Russell closed the Public Hearing at 7:25 p.m.

Public Hearing - Budget

- Mayor Russell opened the hearing at 7:28 p.m.
- Eddie presented the budget numbers in the format of the public notice for everyone in attendance to see.
- No comments were presented at this time.

- *Penny motioned, Tad 2nd to approve the 2012-2013 Budget.* Roll Call Vote was unanimous. Carried.
- Mayor Russell closed the hearing at 7:35 p.m.

DNR Sewer Inspections Report

- Terry McCarthy, of Yaggy Colby, explained 3 infractions the City was cited for by the DNR during the last inspection: illegal discharge, illegal bypassing, and capacity overflow.
- The first 2 were minor issues and have been, or are being addressed as soon as weather permits. The 3rd infraction requires considerable action on the part of the City.
- The City has a permit, based on our system's capacity, to pump 56,000 gallons into the sewer lagoons each day. During 20 of the last 25 months, we have exceeded this permitted level.
- This City must take steps to lower the amount of inflow into the lagoons, or we will be required to build an additional lagoon at an estimated cost of \$500,000+.
- Over the next few months, the City will be cameraing the sewer lines, looking for ground water infiltration. This will give us the information we need to begin to fix the issues.
- More discussion will be held on this during the next several Council meetings.

City Maintenance Report

- Warren, Steve and Buck tried to "MacGeyver" a fix to one of the DNR's citations but the fix didn't work. In the spring they will make a permanent fix.
- Steve took the City truck in to get new tires and brakes.
- Since snow plowing has been minimal, Steve has been working at the proposed Business Incubator. He has been painting, filling in holes in the floors and removing debris.
- Steve has been filling in holes in the Main Street with gravel. It has been too cold to patch it, but as soon as it warms up enough, long enough, he will patch all the holes.

Business Incubator Proposal

- Eddie presented information relating to: program goals, priorities, target business industries and services provided. This information will be available on the City's website within the next few days. (<u>www.fertileiowa.us</u>)
- Eddie suggested the creation of an Economic Development Committee made up of Council members and local business owners and managers.
- The business incubator at the Papajohn Center at NIACC is open to assisting our incubator and helping us get connected to the services already provided by the SBC.
- Eddie presented a budget for finishing the upstairs of the Community Center to house the incubator: (\$16,000 \$20,000 for heating/cooling, electrical, repairs and flooring).
- Eddie presented a 5-year lease structure that would bring in \$16,000+ to cover the bulk of the initial construction cost.
- Jeff suggested using the monthly casino money surplus to cover the remaining costs.
- Tad motioned, Penny 2nd to approve the creation of the Fertile Economic Development Committee, creation of the Business

Incubator Program, final construction of the incubator space, and public notice of request for applicants. Vote was unanimous - Motion Carried.

- Applications for businesses interested in the Business Incubator Program will be available on the website www.fertileiowa.us within the next few days.
- Applications will be presented to the Council at next month's Council meeting.

Mayor's Report

- Had snow and ice storms on January 20th & 21st.
- Mayor Russell met with DNR and has corresponded with the Corps of Engineers and our insurance company in regards to the inspection of the Dam. Dam was last inspected in 1970s.
- The Fertile Days fundraiser went well bringing in \$231 (after expenses) to cover the short-fall from last year's event. POET also gave an additional \$500 for next year's celebration.
- The Fire Department received a WCTA grant for a new laptop computer and software.
- As part of next year's budget, the City will be putting in a new water meter at the Fire Department. *Penny motioned, Tad 2nd to approve the purchase and installation of the meter*. Motion Carried.
- Mayor Russell and Eddie will be working on amending the City's Flood Plain Ordinance. FEMA has updated the flood plain maps – taking many of the Fertile residences formally in the flood plain, out of the flood plain. A proposed map is on display at City Hall. The amendments to the ordinance will be nade during a Public Hearing at next month's Council Meeting.

City Clerk's Report

- Eddie presented the January Financials (58% through the year) Water Sewer Landfill Total (incl. **General Roads** non-budget 68% 69% 66% 48% 59% Income 457% items) 68% 94% 46% 27% Expense -\$5,413 \$3,855 -\$30,072 \$871 Net Income-\$8,217 \$9,634
- Deficit is caused primarily by Housing Grant and Community Center Grant money that has been spent, but has not been reimbursed by the CDBG or the WCDA yet.
- Jeff motioned, Julie 2nd to approve Jan. bills. Motion Carried.

Committee Reports

• Community Center – The sheet rocking has been finished. Painting begins tomorrow and will finish on Friday. The ceiling grid will be put in next week.

Upcoming Meetings

- The Fertile City Council will meet in regular session at 7:00PM, Tuesday, March 20th, 2012, at Fertile City Hall. There will be a Public Hearing to amend the Flood Plain Ordinance at this meeting.
- Penny moved and Jeff 2nd to adjourn the meeting. Carried.

We would like to thank everyone for their support and donations in 2011. Without your help we could not keep our department up

to date with reliable equipment. Thank You! This last year we have gained 8 new volunteer firefighters. Josh Miller and Andrew Hall are working on their first responder course and Chris Hanna, just joined our department, and is an EMT. We are in the process of becoming Fertile Fire and Rescue Department.

In the past year, we have purchased a Polaris Ranger (Hurricane) and a 4x4 Chevy 2500 pickup (swamp monster). Both vehicles were desperately needed and a great asset to our department. We have also purchased more bunker gear as our volunteers have grown. This is a great problem to have! Bunker gear costs around \$2,500.00 per fire fighter. Bunker gear consists of: coat, pants, boots, suspenders, hat, gloves, face cover, and tags. We were also given by the county EMS water rescue equipment.

This January, we applied for the INS Grant given by WCTA for \$1,200.00 and are able to purchase a computer and software. We will be able to put our reports, checking account and our minutes for the meeting on computer. February 9th, Matt Petersen accepted the check. Thank You WCTA and Terry! Election took place in February and they are as follows: Chief - Josh Miller, Ass. Chief - Mike Dahn, Captain -Jeff Berg, Treasurer – Dylan Knopf, Secretary – Josh Bruns, Safety officer – Dan Miller and Dwight Bruns, Training officers – Matt Petersen and Jason Thompson. The next project is to replace our 1976 Ford 600 mini tanker/rescue truck. It no longer is dependable. We tried for a FEMA grant and were turned down. It cost us \$1,000.00 to have the grant written and then to lose it hurt our finances. The cost to replace the mini tanker/rescue is around \$140,000.00. Next step is to locate another grant and try again.

In 2013, all the departments, fire, ambulance, and police/sheriff are required by law to have a new radio, pagers systems installed in their facilities.

MY MEMORIES by Viola Roberts

Just a few words as to what life was like back in the late 1920's and early 1930's. I was 14 years old on May 31, 1928 and had come from a large family of five boys and four girls. I had two brothers and one sister older than me. Everyone was encouraged to work to earn whatever wages they could. There wasn't the variety of work then as there is today, so girls of my age lots of times helped taking care of kids and helping with the house work for different farm families, especially during thrashing time or a new baby arrival.

My first job was helping take care of kids, preparing meals and washing the milking equipment. All farmers had milk cows back then. I will never forget how kind this farmer was in showing this "greenhorn" how to wash that milking equipment. The going wage in that day was \$5.00 a week!

My next job was for a farm family southwest of Fertile who had two small children and a brand new baby. Most babies were born at home and the mothers had to stay in bed for 10 days per Doctors orders. The 9th day it was very important to stay quiet. I was still 14 and had so very, very much to learn that I often wonder why they ever kept me.

Back then no one in the country had electricity as lines hadn't been installed yet. Butter, cream and milk that we now keep refrigerated had to be kept in a cooling tank by the windmill. This tank had very cold water in it at all times and the butter etc., was put in a container and hung in the tank.

This family had a flock of geese that I think enjoyed scaring me to death. They seemed to know when I had to go to the windmill to get butter or cream as they were always there with their mouths open, squawking and flapping their wings. My mission was accomplished but not with singing and laughter.

I went to high school in Fertile, but we didn't have the beautiful new gym, kitchen or class rooms that were added later. Back then if you were caught whispering or passing notes you could be in trouble. The old part of the school that was clear to the north, over the years got in such bad shape it had to be demolished a few years ago. During noon hour or recess, my sister, Verna (Miller) Butts would spend her time fixing her classmates hair. I think it was called "finger waving". Look at the 1930's class pictures and you will see what I mean.

It wasn't all work for us as kids because I remember when we moved to Fertile in June 1928 we came from northern Wisconsin where we lived on 80 acres, that was mostly trees with a few places cleared to plant some small crops. On this so called "farm" was the best

hill for sledding you could imagine as there were no trees, brush, rocks or anything else to stop us from sledding or skiing down the hill. My older brothers, Verle and Alvin, made all our sleds and skis. They also made stilts to walk around on. We played softball and 'anti-l-over' as we called it, that was throwing the ball over the house and the one on the other side throwing it back. Another fun thing was riding horses. There was no money to purchase any of the above, nor was it needed, as I am sure we had just as much fun as anyone today who spends many dollars for different things. As I said, we came to Fertile and all the horseback riding and sledding was over at least for us four older ones, but we still had good times in other ways. Some farmers would clear their hay mows and have a barn dance. The music and the caller were all local men and square dancing was one of our dances. Sometimes dances were held in people's homes, those lucky enough to have a 9x12 rug on the floor, we just shoved the furniture to the wall, rolled up the rug and danced to that old time music. It was all just clean fun. The last job I had before I got married, was southeast of Fertile where they always had at least one hired man so there were six people to cook, wash clothes, etc., so they needed help year around. I was treated like one of the family and was there for three years. During the summer I was there all the time but when school started was there just on weekends. I graduated in May and got married in December. We moved to a little farm in Minnesota for three years, then back to southeast Fertile where we raised our three children: Wayne, Donald and Joanne. God willing, I will be 98 years old on May 31st.
