City Council Meeting Minutes August 21, 2012 - 7:00 PM, City Hall

Call to Order & Roll Call

- Present were: Mayor Joyce Russell; Council Members: Jeff Berg, Julie Jessen, Tad Miller, Penny Miller, Pat Renchin; City Clerk Eddie May & Maintenance Manager Steve Roberts.
- Pat motioned, Penny 2nd to approve the July Minutes. Carried. Chuck Waage/Lori Buchannan – Rehabilitation Housing Grant Extenuating Circumstances
- Chuck requested that the stipulation regarding 5 years residency prior to the sale of a property receiving a Rehabilitation Housing Grant through the City be waived due to extenuating circumstances. Chuck recently suffered a stroke and can no longer live in the home.
- Tad mentioned that the home is still a valid asset to the community and would be concerned that, if the penalty was enforced, the increase in the sales price for the home (to cover the penalty) would discourage buyers.
- Jeff questioned whether Chuck, after the sale of the home, would be willing to pay the \$1200 that the City paid out of the general fund for his project. Chuck said that he would, but that it would be appreciated if the City would waive that off as well, considering his many years of volunteer community service. Chuck also stated that he would much rather stay in the home, and that his health is the only reason for his decision to move.
- Tad motioned, Pat 2nd to waive the 5 years residency rule with no penalties, due to extenuating health related circumstances. Roll call vote was unanimous, motion carried.

Tom Dillavou - PIM Loading Dock - East Side, South Plant

- Tom requested a 12'x14' easement into a portion of land that City owns, which is designated as a future road, to build a new loading dock. The dock would be off the south corner of the east side of their building. Trucks would pull into the dock from the north.
- Discussion by the council considered that there are no plans to extend the road beyond this point; that the loading dock would not interfere with any water or sewer lines; and that this would not impede the flow of storm water.
- Jeff motioned, Pat 2nd to allow the easement with the stipulation that 75% of the property owners within a 100 feet radius from the proposed easement approve in writing, and that the City Attorney draws up the legal paperwork for the easement. Roll call vote was unanimous, motion carried.

Library Floor Plans & Public Notice for Architectural Services

- The Library presented a new set of floor plans without the use of the current structure. The plans allow for complete handicap accessibility, double the current shelf space, an adult reading area with comfortable seating and a fireplace, an internet café, increased computer space, increased storage space, multiple restrooms, and an activity room with kitchen. Plans are available at the Library and at City Hall for review.
- The next step is to post a public notice requesting architectural services to finalize, and professionalize the floor plans. After that is complete, we can solicit bids for construction. The City will hold a Capital Campaign to the public a chance to give, as well as submit grants, to fund the project.
- Penny motioned, Tad 2nd to approve the new plans and to solicit bids for architectural services. Vote was unanimous, motion carried.

City Maintenance Report

- Over the last 60days, there has been damage to the sewer system costing over \$7000 in repairs as t-shirts, underwear, and adult diapers have been chewed up in the sewer grinders. The City has reported these incidents to the Worth County Sherriff's office and have been told that Forest City is also dealing with this issue. Forest City has a system to stop large items from entering their grinders and have so far been able to avoid damage to their system. Steve has been working with Forest City, Yaggy-Colby and Nettleton Excavating to come up with a solution for Fertile. *Tad motioned, Penny 2nd to approve the construction of a catch basin and filtering system, designed by Yaggy-Colby and Nettleton Excavating, at the cost of \$1,200.* Vote was unanimous, motion carried.
- Steve has been busy weed wacking and spraying, rebuilding and repainting the horseshoe pit covers, copper and lead testing the water supply (which passed with flying colors), helping with Fertile Days, and tree trimming.
- The generator at the water treatment plant had an oil change
- Steve and Warren attended classes for their Water Operator's certification
- Steve and Buck have been installing shelving units in a new closet at the Community Center for secured storage of City records.

Mayor's Report

- The City has received an insurance settlement for damages done at the water tower and ball fields by lightning.
- 207 E Main will be up for Sherriff's auction again. Contact the Worth County Treasurer for more information.
- The Downtown Café' was broken into and robbed in July. Other area businesses have been broken into as well. Worth, Winnebago and Cerro Gordo County Sherriff's offices are investigating.
- A water leak was found in front of Earl Kilen's property. It is in the process of being repaired.
- Don & Sharon McLaughlin donated a flag pole for City Hall. It will be installed this week in a well lit area in front of City Hall.
- The City pick-up is in for repairs (leaf-springs)
- Fertile Days was a big hit! A Big Thank You to the Fertile Days Committee and all the volunteers!

City Clerk's Report

- Eddie presented several year-end reports to the Council including: water & sewer reports for the USDA, Streets Report for the Iowa DOT, Debt Report for the State Auditor and the Annual Financial Report (our tax return) for the State Auditor. *Pat motioned, Penny 2nd to approve reports*. Roll call vote was unanimous, motion carried. The reports will be available online by the end of August; the Annual Financial Report will be published in the Northwood Anchor asap.
- The City still owes \$80,000 on a \$300,000 set of bonds and \$143,000 on a \$190,000 note for the sewer system. The City owes \$88,570 on a \$263,000 note and \$13,106 on a \$35,000 for the water system. The City also owes \$17,172 on the Community Center.
- Eddie re-presented the June Financials after adjustments were made in the process of filling out the annual reports.

- Streets & Signs The corner of 1st and Main needs some serious repair. Jeff mentioned that the County will look at the corner and make recommendations for repairs. The City has a 28e agreement with the County for maintaining Main and 1st street as "town-tomarket" roads. A decision will need to be made asap in order to get the work done before the winter.

- There has been a request for information regarding the business incubator. There is still one section of the incubator that is available for development. Any interested party can contact City Hall for a tour of the area as well as information regarding the program including the "discounted" rental structure.
- · Please be aware that the drought has brought several critters into town looking for food that normally would not be here. (raccoons, coyotes, etc.) Please be careful when encountering these animals, especially after dark.
- Jeff moved and Pat 2nd to close the meeting to discuss personnel issues. Roll call vote was unanimous. Motion Carried.
- · Both Joyce and Eddie excused themselves from the Closed Meeting due to conflict of interest. Tad took minutes.
- Julie moved and Pat 2nd to re-open the public meeting. Vote was unanimous. Motion Carried. No action was taken in regards to the closed meeting.

Growing up in Fertile, surrounded by acre after acre of the world's finest farmland, my love of gardening blossomed. My grandmother, Naoma Sheimo, was a gardener on a grand scale, and she made good use of everything that she grew. I especially loved when she would send me to the "fruit room" downstairs to bring up a jar of her watermelon pickles, so sweet and colorful. Nothing those days went to waste, and I learned the lesson well. Just like grandma, I have a pantry brimming with homemade ketchup, salsa, jams & jellies, beans, pickles, peas...the list goes on and on. My love of cooking the last 35 years has led me into a world of unique, unusual, but most importantly, <u>flavorful</u> vegetables.

After living in the Twin Cities for 20 years, my husband, Todd, and I moved to Ely, Minnesota in 2002 and I soon discovered the enormous difference between growing in the Tall Corn State and on the Canadian border. We grow in three 24 × 48 ft greenhouses to combat the deer, the chipmunks and squirrels, as well as the constant threat of frost. Gracie's Garden was established in 2004 after finding myself with a surplus of tomato plants I had grown for my own garden. My customer list from a small ad in the Shopper that year was 10 people; I now sell to hundreds, supply several thousand bedding plants in the spring to the Co-Op in Virajnia, Minnesota, and have a "retail" shop in Ely selling not only 30 plus varieties of tomato plants, but also flowers, hanging baskets, perennials, peppers, and herbs. When the business started to thrive, it needed a name. Gracie is now 8 years old, but at the time, she was just a puppy. I liked the sound of it, and it stuck. Of course, I constantly hear "you must be Gracie", and have been known to answer to it when I'm really busy helping customers. Sometimes, that's just easier.

We use only organic, heirloom and open-pollinated seed (historically grown varieties that are not used in large scale modern agriculture) and non-genetically modified seeds, so the result is old-time flavor and some unique vegetables. We are vigorous stewards of our environment, practicing organic growing methods in our gardens and greenhouses. I also grow lettuce, cucumbers, tomatoes, and herbs hydroponically, using reservoirs of water to recirculate nutrients, feeding and watering the plants around the clock with just what they need to flourish.

Every spring, Gracie's Garden donates a pickup load of bedding plants to the Ely Children's Garden, and the children take their produce to the nursing home to share with the residents. Gracie's Garden supplies fresh vegetables for the Staff at the Grl Scout Canoe Base all summer, operates a small CSA (community supported agriculture - where members receive a weekly allotment of seasonal vegetables in exchange for an up-front fee), and you'll find the Gracie's Garden stand at the Ely Farmers' Market on Tuesday nights, where I am an active and founding member on the board of directors.

Our goal is to provide fresh, organic vegetables that feed our community in both body and spirit. We strive to give to our community as much as we receive. We believe that eating locally creates a greater connection between you and your food sources, supports the local economy, and helps reduce industrialized and processed foods in your diet. If you are ever in the Ely area, stop in. If not, please try Beaver Creek Gardens in Fertile.
