SING!

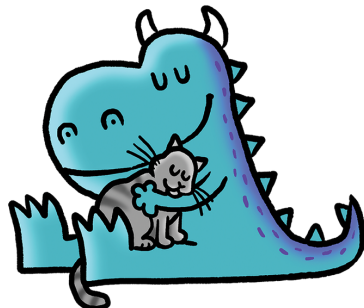
Singing with young children helps them hear different language sounds and rhythms. Singing with your child will aid them in sounding out words.

WRITE!

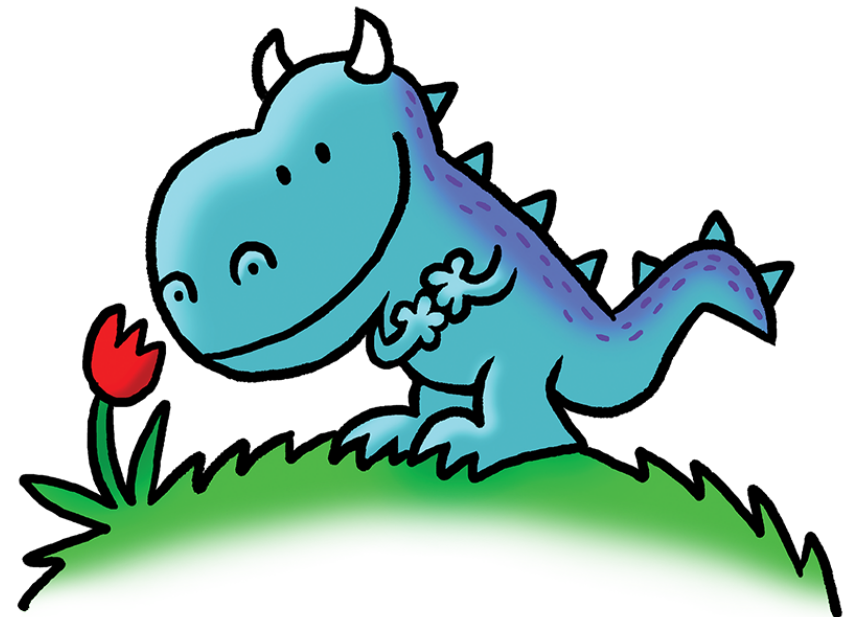
Writing and reading go hand in hand. Let your child see you write and let them scribble and draw. Grasping crayons strengthens fingers for future writing success.

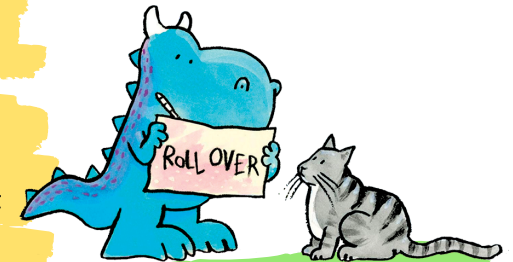
