LIBRARY STORY PART FOUR

Everyone got busy and divided up the jobs. The Task Force worked on a casebook to present to groups for their monetary support. The Friends of the Library began researching grants that were available. The Library Board was working hard presenting to the organizations in town, asking for their support. A list of big money items was put into a booklet giving individuals and groups the chance to purchase those items. Brenda Taylor designed the logo for the campaign and it's still used today.

The Library Board averaged a fundraiser every month, recruiting community members to help with them. For pie sales the community center was filled with folks peeling apples, rolling out dough—everything necessary to make pies. The pies were frozen, orders were taken and pies were delivered on a designated day. This was done for two years (at least) and was a favorite of the community. Various raffles were held for which Board members sold tickets door to door.

Work began on applying for a Vision Iowa CAT grant, which could provide a goodly amount of money if approved. We had to show local governmental support: Linn County gave \$10,000 as did the city. Other grants awarded included: Hall -Perrine Foundation \$250,000, Exchange State Bank (Ernie Buresh) \$100,000. Farmer's State Bank \$7,500 and Roy J. Carver Charitable Trust \$60,000. On August 11, 2004, a caravan of cars made its way to Des Moines to present our case for the Vision Iowa CAT grant. We were awarded a sum of \$200,000 from the CAT grant.

With the amount of money raised we were ready to break ground. On October 30, 2004, a groundbreaking ceremony was held followed by a reception. Construction would start right away!
